The 14th edition of the **International Conference on ICT, Society and Human Beings** (ICT 2021) (part of the IADIS 15th Multi Conference on Computer Science and Information Systems 2021) was held virtually due to the COVID-19 pandemic, during **20-22 July, 2021**.

This conference was organized by the International Association for Development of the Information Society (IADIS).

The effects of ICT on human beings as well as the interaction between ICT, individuals, and society were all within the center of this conference. Both analyses of interactions and effects were important. Changes in behaviour, perspectives, values, competencies, human and psychological aspects and feelings were all of interest. Reflections on past, present, and future challenges – especially planning for handling the latter were encouraged. In general, all types of research strategies were encouraged, and especially cross-disciplinary and multi-disciplinary studies. The main topics for submissions were: Globalization and ICT; Life environment and ICT; Life role and ICT; ICT and effects on humans; Perspectives on ICT; Desirable goals and ICT and Actions for reaching the Good Information Society.

This edition was published jointly with the: 18th International Conference Web Based Communities and Social Media (WBC 2021) and 13th International Conference on e-Health (EH 2021). These conferences received 139 submissions from more than 21 countries. Each submission was anonymously reviewed by an average of four independent reviewers, to ensure that accepted submissions were of a high standard. Consequently, only 22 full papers were approved which meant an acceptance rate of 16%. A few more papers were accepted as short papers and reflection papers.
