



The 18th International Conference on ICT, Society and Human Beings (ICT 2025) (part of the IADIS 19th Multi Conference on Computer Science and Information Systems 2025) was held in Lisbon, Portugal, **23-25 July, 2025**.


This conference was organized by the International Association for Development of the Information Society (IADIS).

The effects of ICT on human beings as well as the interaction between ICT, individuals, and society are all within the focus of this conference. Both analyses of interactions and effects are important. Changes in behaviour, perspectives, values, competencies, human and psychological aspects and feelings are all of interest. Reflections on past, present, and future challenges – especially planning for handling the latter – are encouraged. The ICT, Society and Human Beings 2025 conference addresses in detail seven main aspects: Globalization and ICT; Life environment and ICT; Life role and ICT; ICT and effects on humans; Perspectives on ICT; Desirable goals and ICT and Actions for reaching the Good Information Society.

This edition was published jointly with the: 2nd International Conference on Digital Transformation and Innovation Management (DTIM 2025) and received 153 submissions from more than 27 countries. Each submission has been anonymously reviewed by an average of four independent reviewers, to ensure that accepted submissions were of a high standard. Consequently, only 25 full papers were approved which means an acceptance rate of 16%. A few more papers were accepted as short and reflection papers and posters.


